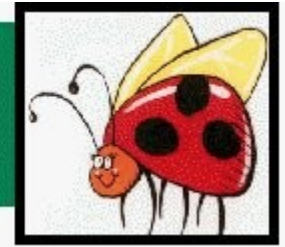

Copic Markers are all the rage and one of the hottest items we sell at Marco's. To find out what is so special about them, we asked Connie Vogt, our resident "Copic Expert," to tell us why she loves them!

Top Ten Reasons to Love Copic Markers

1. The marker ink can be refilled and the nibs replaced, making them both eco-friendly and economical.
2. They are alcohol-based, so they blend beautifully on paper without pilling.
3. They can be used on all types of media — metal, fabric, vellum, tyvek, stone tiles and so much more!
4. Because the markers are translucent, you can achieve great effects by layering colors.
5. The colorless blender is a great tool for creating special effects by pushing or removing color.
6. Fixing mistakes is easy with the colorless blender.
7. You can create perfectly coordinated backgrounds using the markers for airbrushing.
8. In addition to refilling markers, the Various Ink Refills can also be used to make neat backgrounds on glossy paper using the polished stone technique.
9. The Copic Marker Coding System makes it easy to choose colors that naturally blend well together.
10. Copic Markers come in lots of colors (144 for the Ciaos!) and you can use the refills to create your own custom colors, making the possibilities endless!

Rubber Stamping with Copics

My all-time favorite cardstock is Neenah Classic Crest in Solar White or Avalanche White. It is an 80# cardstock with a smooth finish that accepts Copic ink beautifully. The colors seem to float on the surface, making blending easy with little or no "bleeding."

For stamping, I prefer Memento's dye-based inks. Tuxedo Black, London Fog and Paris Dusk are my "go-to colors" for most projects. This ink dries quickly, doesn't fade or bleed when colored with Copics, doesn't ruin your marker tips and doesn't require heat setting. And you can now buy the matching markers for "fixing" those stamping mistakes.

So grab some markers, cardstock, rubber stamps and an ink pad and release your inner child today!
